### X. Grandma database

- A. Introduction: The Grandma database is a genealogical database of people with Low German Mennonite ancestry who originally came from West Prussia and/or Russia. Grandma stands for "Genealogical Registry AND Database of Mennonite Ancestry." The Grandma database is a compilation of the contributions of genealogical information from dozens of Mennonite genealogists. The genealogical data has all been merged together to create one unified database. The Grandma Project is organized by a genealogical project committee under the auspices of the California Mennonite Historical Society in Fresno, California. The price for the Grandma 5 CD is \$30 plus shipping.   1. large size
  2. many early church records have already been entered
  3. multiple contributors
- H. Weaknesses:
  1. many contributors entered few or no sources for their data
  2. information on Mennonites in Germany and South America is underrepresented
