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### XI. Suggested "To do" List for the typical Mennonite genealogist

1. Compile all available genealogical and historical data on your family and relatives from currently available sources, using in particular as resources older family members, old journals, and family genealogical records, among many other sources.
2. Publish your genealogical data in some format. Give copies of your work to local and major Mennonite archives.
3. Provide copies and/or scans of old genealogical records, journals, pictures, etc. to major Mennonite archives.
4. Consider putting some version of your genealogical data on a personal web site.
5. Consider putting some version of a gedcom file of your genealogical data on some of the major web sites such as the World Family Tree database at <http://www.ancestry.com/share/awt/main.htm> or on the WorldConnect Project at <http://worldconnect.rootsweb.com>.
6. Consider donating some version of a gedcom file of your data to the Grandma database.
7. Consider volunteering to help on some of the Mennonite genealogy extraction projects currently underway or start your own project.
